Chemehuevi ASAP Program is hosting an art contest which focuses on Families in Recovery. Most everyone in the world will know someone who is hurt by drugs or alcohol and substances hurt the family. Be creative and submit an original artwork which focuses on a family working through challenges of addiction towards or is in recovery.

Divisions: Children 4-10 years old

Youth 11-17 years old

Adults 18+ years old

Contest Rules: 1 entry per person. The theme should be represented in the picture. Minimum size 16"x20", maximum size 18"x24". The entry form must be taped on the back of the poster. ASAP Program will provide materials to the first 20 entry's – poster board, pencils and markers. No mixed media – photographs, paint, etc. Only use pencils and washable markers. Any violation of the contest rules will disqualify the person's poster.

Materials can be picked up at the Community Center from 4-7pm August 17, 2015 or after at the Drop In Center.

DEADLINE: September 14, 2015 at 4pm at the Drop In Center or the Community Center at 6pm.

Winning Art Work will be displayed in various Tribal offices for 1 year and returned to the winner at Indian Days 2016.

Prizes:

Children – 1st place \$25 gift card and art supplies
2nd place art supplies

Youth – 1st place \$25 gift card and art supplies
2nd place art supplies

Adults – 1st place \$25 gift card and art supplies
2nd place art supplies

Contest will be judged by 2 tribal staff members. Winners will be announced at the Indian Days Celebration, September 19th 2015.
